

The Gospel Pop-Quiz

1. What is the gospel?

It is the good news about how sinners can be saved from hell and have the free gift of eternal life. Jesus has provided this by dying for your sins, being buried and then raising from the dead, I Corinthians 15:3-4: "For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures."

2. Who does the gospel (good news) apply to?

Everyone ever born! So anyone who believes his own sins were paid by Jesus on the Cross, also goes to heaven: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

3. How do we receive the gospel?

By faith or believing in Jesus. Luke 7:50. John 1:12. John 6:47: "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me hath everlasting life. "

It's just that simple. If you believe in Jesus He promises eternal life.

4. Once you have received the gospel can you ever be lost?

No. Once saved, always saved. John 6:37-40. John 11:26: "And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this?"

In other words: if a person is alive and they believe in Jesus for eternal life they will never go to hell and will go to heaven no matter what!

5. But what if we keep on sinning?

Everyone keeps on sinning. Ecclesiastes 7:20. Plus if we keep on sinning grace keeps on abounding. Romans 5:20: "Moreover the law entered, that the offence might abound. But where sin abounded, grace did much more abound."

When you sin, you must use I John 1:9 in order to recover fellowship with God, per I John 1:3-10. Those verses and I John 2 also show that you cannot grow up spiritually or properly read Bible when you are not in fellowship with God. Else in a state of sin you will be punished, Psalm 32:5, 66:18, Colossians 3:25, I Corinthians 11:28-30, I John 5:16. So you cannot lose salvation, but you can lose spiritual growth and fellowship with God.

The gospel is just good news anyway you look at it. God bless.
