## **Meter Import**

Paul writes in 4166 aka AD 60, Lord age 63, January-March, maybe near vernal equinox or at Passover?

o 28 years +4166 = 4194, latest pre-Church Trib START. Year is still 4165 vernal pre-equinox.

o 28 – 4165 vernal = 4137 when Christ died = 4136 vernal START=Adamic 4136.5. So valuation year is disregarded.

o **63** from 4166 = 4103 1<sup>st</sup> Adamic quarter, when He was born. So Paul writes post-Chanukah.

o 63 +4166 = 4229, don't know why. Have to check Zecharias' meter text (28 years post Mill START; his prophecy went to 4240).

• 4165 *vernal* -31.5 -1 = 4133.5, start of the Lord's Ministry. Has the effect of converting to Adamic year.

• 4165 *vernal* +31.5 = 4196.5, mid-Trib. Has the effect of converting to Adamic year.

He can't be age **63** when Paul writes unless post-Chanukah. So the cusp-like valuation above, might be based on His Birthday as a fiscal, rather than either vernal or Adamic, implying he writes sometime in January?
